- State the novel’s title and author’s name in your topic sentence.
- Introduce the main character (protagonist) in the story.
- Include his or her name, character traits/qualities.
- Discuss what conflict/problem the main character faces in the story.
- Be sure to include the answer to who, what, when, where, and how.

_____ **Paragraph #2:** Summarize what happens to build the conflict.

- What major decision(s) did the main character have to make?
- How the conflict is solved in the end.
- Use transition words to help your summary flow.
- What theme/lesson did you learn from the character’s experiences?

_____ **Paragraph #3:** Write a paragraph giving your opinion on the book.

- Include why you like or dislike the book. Give details, for example, was the book’s storyline easy or difficult to follow?
- Was the series of events told in order, or were there flashbacks and foreshadows?
- Was it predictable/believable?
- Did you like the ending?
- What was your favorite part?
- What connections did you make with your life and/or other books or movies?
- Discuss the author’s style of writing and give examples from the book.

_____ **Paragraph #4:** Explain whether you would recommend this book to a friend.

- Rate the book from 1 star to 5 stars and give reasons and examples to defend your rating.
- Examples should include a quote or quotes from the book or a summary of the part of the book that you enjoyed or did not enjoy.
