



GETTING READY FOR PRE-K 3

Read!

The best way to prepare your child for school is simple: read to them every day. It builds language and literacy skills, expands their understanding of the world, and creates special bonding time together.

Train 'em up!

Children who enter preschool already knowing how to listen to adults, make eye contact, follow directions, and be kind to others tend to do very well in the classroom. Preschool teachers don't expect perfect behavior—it's a place to learn and grow. But it helps when children have some guidance at home.

Play!

Let your child have lots of opportunities to build, create, get messy, and explore. Let them be outside often. And make sure they play on their own at times, too!

Encourage Independence!

Before school, teach your child basic skills like using the bathroom, washing hands, opening snacks, feeding themselves, and putting on shoes. Instead of doing everything for them, guide them through it.

Introduce Letters & Numbers

Make learning letters and numbers fun and part of everyday life. Point out letters, count things you see, name colors, and talk about sounds in words.
