Dear Parents,

The question I have been asked many times in the last couple weeks is, "Has the school year gotten off to a good start?" My answer is always a resounding, "Yes!" With 503 students in the high school, we are excited about the growth in enrollment this year despite raising the standards for admission. We have tightened up and simplified a few policies, and the overwhelming response has been positive. Our teachers are coming to work each morning with a renewed eagerness and desire to serve. Our students are working hard and looking out for one another. It's fun to be a Parkview Eagle!

In chapel this past week, *Mr. Yancy Wilmot* challenged our students to understand the joy and excitement that comes with having a relationship with Jesus Christ. The time of worship we enjoyed prior to the message was glorifying to the Lord, and it's an awesome thing to watch our students honor Him. I have received overwhelmingly positive feedback from our students toward our Bible classes this year. We worked hard over the summer to organize and re-establish our Bible curriculum. It is exciting to see the fruit that is already apparent from the studying of God's Word. Every morning, our Student Body Chaplain *Avery Friedmann*, opens our school day with a word of prayer. We want to remember to be dependent upon the Lord every hour of the day.

I had the privilege this week of recognizing our students who have challenged themselves academically. We have **116 students** enrolled in our **Advanced Placement** classes and **nearly 50** in our **Dual Enrollment** classes. These students have taken it upon themselves to reach for a higher standard of excellence in the academic realm. The skillset they learn in these classes is invaluable on the collegiate level. *Mrs. Jessica Shelton,* our College Advisor, has been meeting one-on-one with about ten seniors each day to assist them in planning for college. The students who have not yet had the opportunity to meet with her are often waiting at her door asking when it will be their turn. There is a growing expectation of academic excellence at PBS.

If you walk the hallways of our buildings, you will already see examples of our students' creativity coming to life. Artwork is hanging outside of *Ms. Emily Babin's* Art classroom. Our film students in *Mrs. Lori Kaiser's* Historical Films class are learning about the richness and depth of classics like *Citizen Kane*. Our marching band under the leadership of *Mr. Sean Bramley* is ready to rumble at our first home football game in just a few short weeks. The Lord has blessed so many of our students with exceptional talent.

Many of you received a taste of great things to come at our football scrimmage this past Friday night. Under the leadership of *Coach Jay Mayet*, our Eagles are hungry to get back to the Dome. Our first home football game is coming up on **Thursday, September 17th** versus John Curtis. It should be a night to remember. Our volleyball team, coached by *Mrs. Becky Madden*, is poised to begin their season this week with warm-up action in the jamborees. Our cross country runners, led by *Coach Sam Barham*, are

becoming stronger and faster each day as they stretch their physical limits beyond what they knew they were capable. Get your Eagle Wear ready, and prepare to cheer on our teams!
